CONSEQUENCE	If the situation in [LHS] doesn't occur, the situation in [RHS] would arise.	[LHS] because if not [LHS], [RHS]	[I like you too.] <sub>LHS</sub> Otherwise, [we wouldn't be friends.] <sub>RHS</sub>
↪ ARGUMENTATION	[RHS] is <i>undesirable</i> and can be possibly avoided by following [LHS]	To avoid [RHS], [LHS]	[We have to operate immediately.] <sub>LHS</sub> Otherwise, [she will die.] <sub>RHS</sub>
ENUMERATION	It doesn't take the failure of [LHS] to consider [RHS] as another option.	There are more than one option for [goal]: They are [LHS] and [RHS]	[I like a nice curry.] <sub>LHS</sub> Otherwise, [I'll nibble on fruit.] <sub>RHS</sub>
EXCEPTION	[LHS] is an exception to [RHS]	Generally [RHS], an exception is that [LHS].	[There were people riding horses.] <sub>LHS</sub> Otherwise, [there was nobody.] <sub>RHS</sub>
