On behalf of everyone who was involved in SENSEVAL-2, we are happy to provide this volume of papers by the teams who participated in SENSEVAL-2, the second organized evaluation of word sense disambiguation systems. This volume constitutes the proceedings of the Second International Workshop on Evaluating Word Sense Disambiguation Systems that was held on July 5-6, 2001 in Toulouse (in conjunction with the 39th Annual Meeting of the ACL).

Everyone who participated in SENSEVAL-2 by either submitting a system or organizing a task was invited to submit a 4-page paper to this proceedings.
