## **Rhetorical Questions in Social Media**

## Motivation

- Rhetorical Questions (RQs) are a type of figurative language aimed at achieving some pragmatic goal
- Many uses are sarcastic, but there are other uses (Ilie '94, Schaffer '05)
- We note use of **argumentation** in forums and **persuasion** in tweets
- We use data from the Internet Argument Corpus for debate (Walker et al. '12), and Twitter

**Corpus Creation** 

• We develop a "middle-of-post" heuristic to gather data: • Speaker asks a question, then continues their turn • 75% of these are found to be RQs

Sarc	If they haven't been discovered yet, HOW THE BLOODY HELL DO YOU KNOW? Ten percent more brains and you'd be pond life.	You know what's the best? Unreliable friends. They're so much fun. #sarcasm #whatever
Other	How is that related to deterrence? Once again, deterrence is preventing through fear of consequences.	Craft ladies, salon owners, party planners? You need to state your #business [link]

• We end up with a large, novel set of RQs in forums and Twitter:

• We create a small dataset of ~1K of each class (RQ vs Information-seeking) • We experiment with simple W2V features on SVM (80/20 train/test)

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**The Effect of Context** 

• Forums posts are more sensitive to changes in context due to length

**Linguistic Features** 

• We analyze the most discriminative LIWC features by class and domain
